Instructions to apply for travel grants

To apply for travel grants to participate in Roskilde seminar, the following documents should be submitted to the national contact person in the country where you are enrolled in a university.

- 1. An abstract (max. 250 words) stating the name of the applicant, academic affiliation, title of abstract and the body of abstract. You can also specify whether the upcoming manuscript is part of your PhD dissertation (chapter, article) or if you plan to have it published in an academic journal.
- 2. Travel plan, specifying the planned travel route and the estimated travel costs.

The due date for applications is December 31st, 2011. The decisions on travel grants will be sent out in early January 2012. Note that accommodation in Roskilde will be arranged and the expenses covered for successful applicants.

Keynote speakers will be announced during the month of December, 2011.

Instructions to apply for participation

If you do not wish to apply for a travel grant, but to present a paper otherwise, send an abstract to the national contact person. The abstract should be sent by January 31st, 2012.

This includes; an abstract (max. 250 words) stating the name of the applicant, academic affiliation, title of abstract and the body of abstract. You can also specify whether the upcoming manuscript is part of your PhD dissertation (chapter, article) or if you plan to have it published in an academic journal.

Common practicalities

Abstracts should be written in English, which is the common language used in the seminar. Paper manuscripts should be sent prior to February 28th 2012. This will allow each commentator sufficient time to review and prepare comments on the paper. The student should prepare to present his/her paper (max. 10 minutes). Time reserved for the discussion of each draft is minimum twenty minutes. A suggested reading list will be issued later on this page.
