

Instructions to apply for travel grants

To apply for travel grants to participate in Tallinn seminar, the following documents should be submitted to the national contact person in the country where you are enrolled in a university.

1. An abstract (max. 250 words) stating the name of the applicant, academic affiliation, title of abstract and the body of abstract. You can also specify whether the upcoming manuscript is part of your PhD dissertation (chapter, article) or if you plan to have it published in an academic journal.
2. Travel plan, specifying the planned travel route and the estimated travel costs.

The due date for applications is April 15th, 2012. The decisions on travel grants will be sent out April 30th 2012. Note that accommodation in Tallinn will be arranged and the expenses covered for successful applicants.

Instructions to apply for participation

If you do not wish to apply for a travel grant, but to present a paper otherwise, send an abstract to the national contact person. The abstract should be sent by April 30th, 2012.

This includes; an abstract (max. 250 words) stating the name of the applicant, academic affiliation, title of abstract and the body of abstract. You can also specify whether the upcoming manuscript is part of your PhD dissertation (chapter, article) or if you plan to have it published in an academic journal.

Common practicalities

Abstracts should be written in English, which is the common language used in the seminar. Paper manuscripts should be sent prior to May 25th 2012. This will allow each commentator sufficient time to review and prepare comments on the paper. The student should prepare to present his/her paper (max. 10 minutes). Time reserved for the discussion of each draft is minimum twenty minutes. A suggested reading list will be issued later on this page.
